Hello Jeannie,

The khighte in the photo has these dimensions:

Wing span - 60 inches
Distance between wings along spine - 18 inches
Wing tips - 8 inches
Tail - 44 inches
Tail to lower wing - 8.5 inches
Head is made of two bamboo sticks taped to spine and top wing
Spine is made of basswood or spruce for near-perfect straight quality.
Approximate sail area - 6 square feet

I have 12 to 15 khightes ready to fly, ranging from 3 sq. ft to 9 sq. ft sail area; wing spans ranging from 3 ft to 6 ft. If I make them any bigger they won't fit at the back of my car.

There are at least two dozen frames ready for skinning, for which I use black plastic bag,

clear plastic bag (when I want to go stealthy), colored cellophane, or colored Christmas wrap. The skin is applied with nothing but one mill clear tape. I don't use ripstop for skin because I want to go "lo tech or bamboo tech", besides I don't know how to sew.

I applied a new idea to one khighte last night to prevent wing stall, which sometimes plague a few of my khightes. It's so simple it should work. Again, as soon as I win the

lotto, I will apply a patent for it.

Very simple theory why I believe my khighte design will beat a delta design for the record:

The delta design is built for speed. The wind passing thru it is exited to the rear which

gives it a forward push, hence greater speed. My khighte, which is a variation of some

Asian bird-like design (gurion to the Philippines where I grew up), traps the wind and

vent it thru the wing tips in equal and opposite direction, giving the khighte balance and

greater upward lift. Simple physics, not rocket science. I failed a physics class in college.

Warning! Don't get too attached to my khightes. They are addictive.
